Summary of Key Findings for this School

The school's overall rating is **SATISFACTORY** because:

- The school has an administrative office a talking wall which was sizeable enough to hold emergency meetings.
- Where the food item was stored and the catering services were good.
- But there was no accommodation for the teachers. The learners could also not access any reading materials of their choice because of the absence of a library.

The school has the following strengths

- The caterers were neatly dressed with health certificates from the District assembly.
- The store room where the learner's food was kept was also good.
- There were free range food vendors which help to supplement the learners' food given to them by the school.
- The learner to teacher ratio of 26 was also satisfactory.
- The total enrolment of 466 was also encouraging.

What does the school need to do to improve further?

- The headteacher and the senior leaderships team should put in place a well-documented vision which is owe by the stakeholders of the school.
- The headteacher and the senior leadership team should have a plan that will guide them to improve upon teaching and learning based on data collected form the school.
- Again, there should be productive relationship between the headteacher and the various stakeholders of the school including the SMC and the PTA.
- The headteacher and senior leadership should ensure that either the learners in the lower and upper primary go to break at different times or the number of caterers are increased to save the situation where learners precious 30min is wasted each day in serving the learners during lunch time.

Information about this Inspection

The inspection of this school was carried out under **Education Act 778 of 2008 as amended by the Education Regulatory Bodies Act 2020 (ACT 1023)**. The National Schools Inspectorate Authority conducts school inspections through the deployment of its Inspection Evaluation Framework (IEF) as documented in the Ghana National Inspections Handbook, 2019. This inspection was carried out by an Inspection Panel (IP) consisting of one Lead Inspector/Team Lead and a Team Inspector.

During this inspection, the IP interviewed school leadership, staff, learners, parents, School Management Committee (SMC)/ Board of Governors, Parent Teacher Association (PTA). They observed the School's work and looked at a wide range of relevant documentation and conducted Lesson Observations in English Language, Mathematics, and Science.

Information about the School

Wiamoase D/A DINN ISLAMIC KG/ PRIMARY 'A' is located in a suburb of Wiamoase called Domenase. The school was established in 1968.

Wiamoase a town in the Ashanti Region is administratively found in the Sekyere South District. Educationally the school is found in the Wiamoase North Circuit.

The enrolment figure at the time of inspection was 232 boys and 234 girls, given us a total of 466 learners.

The school is proud to have a gender balance number of teaching staff. Both the male and female teachers were 9 making the total number of teachers to be 18.

The school was managed by Salifu Bukari, with the following telephone number 0245487358. At the day of visit the headteacher was on official assignment outside the town. The assistant headteacher Anane Frank with Telephone number 0246670185 stood in for the headteacher.

We want to place on record that Mr. Anane, knew everything about the school which made our interaction very interesting.

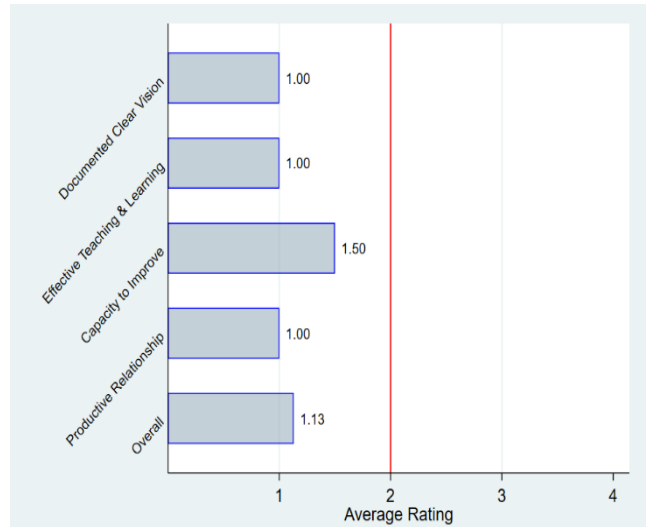

School Leadership

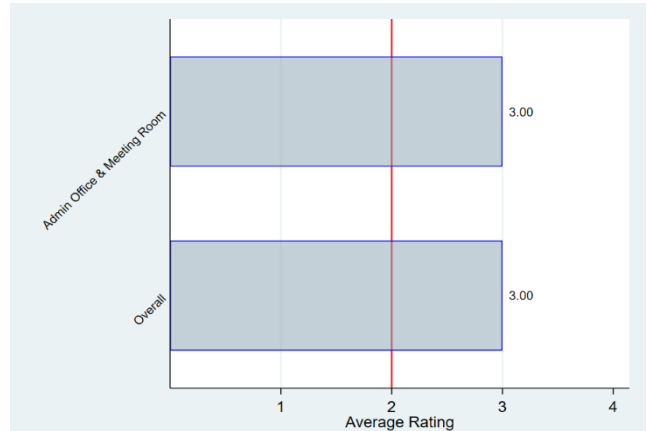
The headteacher and the senior leadership team did not have a clearly documented vision for the school. There was no documented plan to monitor teaching and learning and also to evaluate learners' performance. Also, there was no productive relationship between the headteacher and the SMC/PTA.



Infrastructure

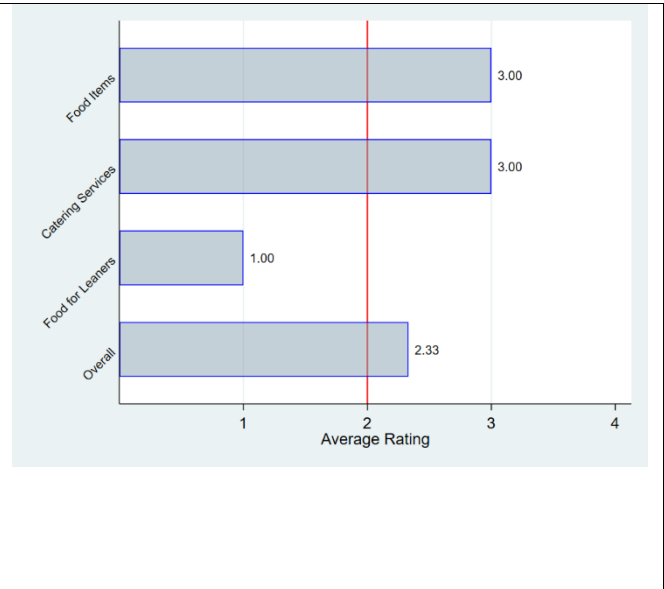
There was no accommodation for teachers or library in the school. Additionally, the school had neither computer laboratory nor computers, and learner desk ratio (0.8:1) was unsatisfactory.

Food Safety

The caterers as well as the food vendors had a health certificate which were issued by the District Assembly. They were neatly dressed with their head gears on, but the kitchen in which the learners' food was prepared needs a serious renovation. The way the food was shared to the learners should also be changed. All the learners had to queue in front of the for only two caterers to serve them.

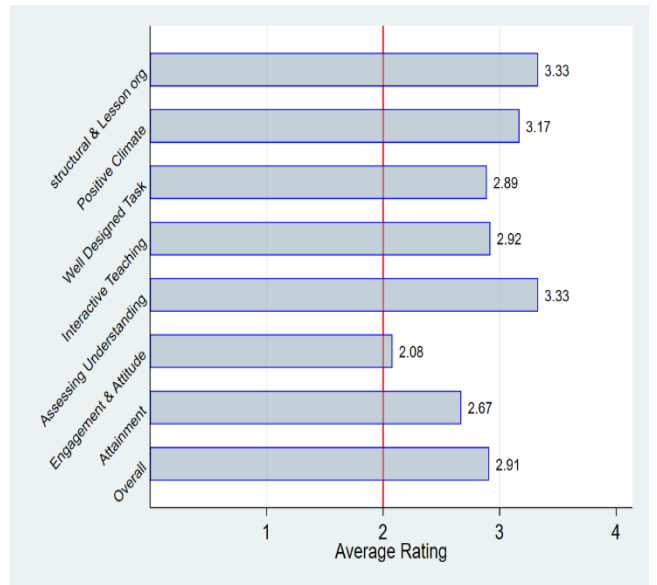

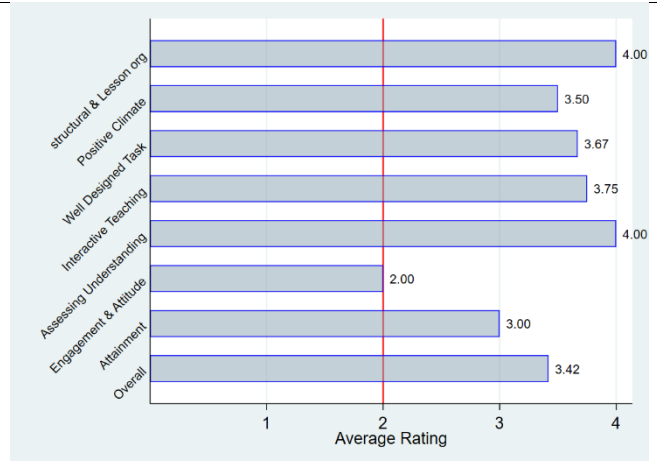
English

The lesson plans were available, they followed the acceptable formats but only partially covered the relevant sub-topics. Again, the various stages of the lesson were clearly developed, but pacing was inappropriate. Also, the oral and written questions in the course of the lesson that were used to test learners understanding were properly answered. Learners however were not encouraged to ask question. Few of the learners were able to complete the assignment given at the end of the lesson.



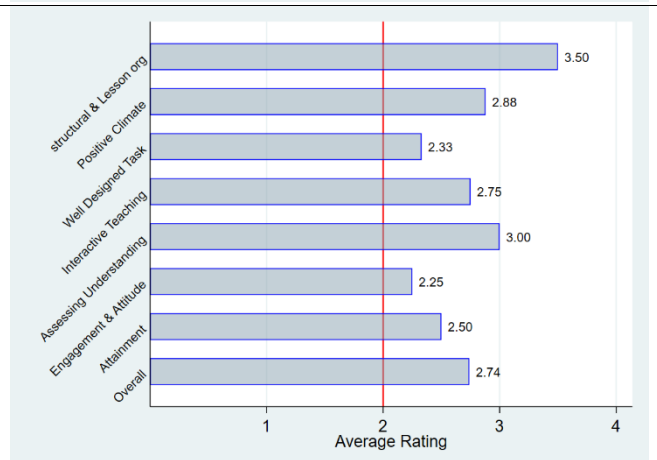
Mathematics

Students asked open-ended questions and the teachers responded superficially. Again, further opportunities existed for group work but learners work collaboratively in their groups. Most students completed the task assigned to them during the lesson delivery.



Science

Lesson plans were available, followed the acceptable format, provided adequate information but only partially covered the relevant sub-topics. Again, various stages of the lesson were clearly defined and developed but pacing was inappropriate. Further, Teachers monitored for learners understanding by using oral and written question during the lesson delivery.



<p>Teachers sometimes provided prompt feedbacks and encouraged peer feedback to guide their own learning. Despite the above, few of the learners asked open ended questions at the end of the lesson.</p>


